## **Caregiving in NC**



#### The Realities

- The <u>demographic shifts</u> in NC are creating unprecedented demand for paid and family caregivers
- Many caregivers cannot (or <u>do not have</u>) access to needed services and there are long wait lists for existing caregiving resources
- The pandemic <u>reduced access to social support and in home services</u>, creating added stressors for patients and their caregivers
- Caregivers are often <u>left out of the conversations with patients</u> and not acknowledged as <u>essential care partners</u>
- NC <u>does not have a task force or council</u> dedicated to collecting and analyzing caregiver data and advocating solely for the needs of caregivers
- Several organizations have education materials and online services for caregivers, yet, not all caregivers can access online resources
- The <u>national momentum and innovative models</u> in other states provide a unique opportunity to act

### **How Can We Support Caregivers\***



It is not when, but how

- Establish a <u>NC Caregiver Task Force</u> to analyze state data, legislative solutions, and financing options and promote best practices and strategies for supporting caregivers in the state
- Look for ways to develop <u>mutual aid systems</u> of caregiver support across counties
- Identify <u>costs and burdens</u> associated with caregiving, incorporating input from diverse stakeholders
- Study the <u>needs of care recipients and care provided</u> by family caregivers
- Examine the impact of <u>enhanced resources directly to caregivers</u> (e.g., direct pay/reimbursement to caregivers).
- Study <u>disparities</u> in availability of and access to caregiver services
- Develop the <u>serious illness care and special needs health sector workforce</u>
- Study ways the <u>state and private sector employers</u> can support employees with caregiving responsibilities
- Engage the North Carolina General Assembly, the governor, and other constituents





Become a top-ranked state relative to support for caregivers of citizens with serious illness and disabilities across the lifespan.
